Readings

The Old Testament - Proverbs 8:1-4; 22-31

Does not Wisdom call, and does not Understanding raise her voice? On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out: “To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all that live....The Holy One established me first of all, the foremost of creation, long ago. I was made in the very beginning, at the first, before the world began. I was born before the oceans, when there were no springs of water. I was born before the mountains, before the hills were set in place, before the Creator made the earth and its fields or even the first handful of soil.”

“I was there when the Holy One set the sky in place and stretched the horizon across the ocean, when the clouds were placed in the heavens and the springs of the ocean were opened. I was present when the boundaries were set for the waters of the sea, and when the earth's foundations were laid. I was beside the Holy One like an architect, a daily source of joy, always happy in the Divine Presence - happy with the world, and delighted with the human race.”

The New Testament - Matthew 28:16-20

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to observe everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, even to the end of the age.”

The Continuing Testament - from *With Us to the End of the Age* - by Kelly Johnson

Historically, Jesus’ “Great Commission” to “go and make disciples of all nations” has been sadly misused as an excuse for dominating people of other lands. The history of Christian missions cannot be told apart from the history of European colonialism, racism, and economic imperialism. This passage from Matthew can be twisted as a call to make everyone in the world “one of us”; which means getting control over them and wiping-out all that is different about them - for their own good, of course! This “Great Commission” sounds awfully close to granting permission for dominating those who are different from us.

Throughout his ministry, however, Jesus reveals a compassionate and caring Holy One; One who rejoices in allowing all creatures to live fully and freely. Jesus’ disciples are not an army ordered to make all nations subject; nor are they franchise owners sent out to increase the market-share for their exclusive brand. They are followers of the humble, serving, Crucified One; and they are sent to welcome into their motley, eclectic company all of the broken and beautiful people of the world.

Jesus’ followers are commissioned to teach everyone [and to keep learning for themselves] how to obey *all* that he taught them. This includes turning the other cheek when attacked, going the second mile, giving freely to all who ask, reaching-out to society’s disenfranchised and downtrodden. They are to love their enemies, and to welcome strangers and neighbors alike into their community. They are not called to conquer or manipulate others, but to freely share Christ’s love with them.


