## **Pastor's Ponderings.....**

### **RALLY DAY**

In the olden days, New England Congregational churches like ours tended to coast through the summer. Summer was time to tend the farm, tend the crops and work through those longer daylight hours. When September came, it was time to ring the bell, get back to school and back to church.

One book on How to Conduct a Sunday School (1905) wrote about a newfangled idea called "Rally Day": *"This festival is rapidly growing in favor. It usually comes at the end of the summer break-up, and is used as a means of rallying the forces again for the work of fall and winter. When a general is preparing for a battle he is said to rally his forces. When a sick person begins to recover it is said of him that he is rallying. ... All of these phrases may be applied to the Sunday-school work; we are rallying our forces for the great campaign of the fall and winter..."*

Rally Day has evolved over the 206-year history of Brecksville UCC. But the purpose remains a good one. It reminds us to rally our congregation and get moving as we kick-off Sunday School, choir, and our other church programs.

This year, Rally Day takes on special significance. When COVID-19 suddenly shut us down many church activities, groups, meetings, and gatherings went dormant. It has been exciting to see things coming back to life in a post-COVID renaissance. But we're still recovering.

The Stewardship/Leadership Development Ministry recently met to discuss this. Here is a quote from the minutes of our last meeting: *"Many ministries have become dormant or are hardly functioning. The Old Guard is tired. Newer members or members who have never participated need to be invited to get involved... We need a plan to get people out of the pews or out from behind their computer screens and participating in ministries. Please help!"*

### **FACILITIES**

Window World installed the window replacement in Unit B of the Arlington property on August 1<sup>st</sup> – the cost was \$1040, and the tenant has paid for half of it. Also, a water leak in this same unit's sink/fixture was repaired. New fixture and shut-off valves were installed, and the total cost is not yet available.

The parking lot has been repaired, coated and stripped, at a cost of \$12,100.

The new sink and faucet for the flower room have been replaced at a cost of \$1000.

Pastor John and Cliff Cribbs installed a pulley system for raising the banners on the front of church.

The front doors of the church are in need of painting. Will seek a volunteer for this project.

The gutters on the front and rear of the educational wing are in need of cleaning. Will seek for bids for this project.

**AUTUMN 2022 MUSIC MINISTRY** - It's time to rev up our music ministry again here at BUCC! If you enjoy singing in a group or playing an instrument, here are some opportunities for you to share your musical talent with our wonderfully affirming congregation:

**(PLEASE NOTE: All practices begin on Thursday, September 8<sup>th</sup>.)**

- **Adult Choir** – Practice starts at 7:00 pm. This is an excellent form of musical/spiritual preparation for Sunday services. Rehearsals last until 8:15(-ish).
- **Joyful Noise** – Practice starts at 5:30 pm. Since many of our children are involved in after-school activities, recordings of the songs will be sent via email or text, to parents of kids ranging from K-5th grade. - **Percussion Group** - This group rehearses on an as-needed basis, usually Sunday morning before service.
- **Instrumentalists** - If you want to play an instrument during the service, please let Dave know!

## **Compassion Fatigue**

Compassion defies definition. The thesaurus describes compassion as empathy, concern and care. But even with this help, compassion is difficult to define.

Fatigue, on the other hand, is easily defined - "I'm tired." In 2003, when I was a Fulbright Scholar in Bucharest, Romania, I first heard the words "compassion" and "fatigue" linked together. My ears perked up because I was suffering from compassion fatigue at that time. Now, I realize that I still wrestle with it. I feel I'm fresh out of compassion - empathy, concern and care. I'm fatigued at feeling emotionally drained. If I had an ounce of control, I would take the blame for my fatigue and call it by its correct name - self-pity. But, my self-pity feeds on something fueled by local people who need my compassion.

In Bucharest, a poor man with one leg sat on a bench on one of the main streets. Despite his loss, he had a keen sense of humor. He smiled and laughed when he saw someone he knew. When I went to offer coins and "best wishes," I was stopped by a woman holding something wrapped in a blanket – a baby? Probably just a decoy to fool a gullible American. She insisted she deserved my compassion more than the man, and my anger erupted in rage. Was this compassion fatigue? Neither person got a coin from me that day. Their "compassion competition" caused me much suffering about my anger at two people who clearly both needed help.

When we can't help, we might look the other way and become insensitive – but this hurts us more than others.

A few days later, I again saw the one-legged man. He called to me and waved. I gave him several coins, which evoked a big laugh from him. I wished him well - language wasn't a barrier to sharing good wishes.

Despite Bucharest's crowded conditions and petty crime, I needed to maintain compassion. I fought to not let my emotions be diluted by seeing too much that was beyond my ability to help.

I work to protect myself from compassion fatigue. I need to do all that I can to not emotionally detach from the misfortune of others. I might be emotionally dead from compassion fatigue – or perhaps experiencing the "fullness of life", which includes both the joy of good times, and the pain/fatigue from having a caring heart.
