Pastor's Ponderings.....

Christian nationalism is a poisonous ideology. It has moved from a fringe belief system to one now openly advocated by prominent leaders. Christian nationalism is increasing and that should alarm us. But what is "Christian Nationalism? How is it different from nationalism or patriotism?

Patriotism is the love of one's country. I am a patriotic U.S. veteran. Patriots uphold the constitution, engage in productive dialogue and, most importantly, we vote.

Nationalism privileges a particular cultural identity into law; in some cases (e.g. Germany 1933) it dangerously enshrines some ethnicities and religions, while suppressing the civil liberties of others. Albert Einstein said, "Nationalism is an infantile disease. It is the measles of humanity."

Christian Nationalism is the belief that the U.S. is and should always be a "Christian nation." It is packaged with white supremacy, authoritarianism, patriarchy, and militarism. Writers like Samuel Huntington argue that white Anglo Saxon Protestants have had a privileged position in the public square and he's part of a "culture war" to keep it that way.

Christian Nationalism holds that the U.S. was appointed by God to be a Christian nation. It holds that all other religions and races would submit to white Christians. Studies correlate it to distrust of minorities and immigrants. It erases the line that separates church and state. In fact, last summer, one congressperson stated publicly, "I'm tired of this separation of church and state junk."

Junk?

The founders of the U.S. tended to be people of faith. But they were adamant about avoiding any appearance of merging Christianity with governance. This mattered so much that while George Washington was president, he declined to receive communion. Jefferson and Madison wrote of the separation of church and state. It was not "junk" to them for they had witnessed the deadly consequences of life without that separation. So, I find it disconcerting to see Christian nationalism surging again.

Amanda Tyler is the lead organizer of Christians Against Christian Nationalism. She states bluntly, "Christian nationalism is NOT Christianity... it takes Christianity's central message, which is a Gospel of love, and turns it into a false idol of power." Rev. Jim Wallis said, "White Christian Nationalism is the single greatest threat to democracy in America – and to the integrity of the Christian witness."

We can be deeply patriotic without being narrowly nationalist. Our faith is personal, but it is not private. We can and should march and write for legislation that reflects our moral priorities.

Christian - But let's be clear. The words and actions of Jesus challenge us to seek the common good in a way that builds a bigger table, not a bigger wall. Jesus reached beyond the cultural barriers and exclusions. He reached out to Romans, Samaritans, women and many others considered taboo.

Likewise, we seek dialogue and understanding of beliefs and cultures different than our own. If that cultural "dialogue" devolves into a culture "war," then we've already lost. Because, like Jesus, we don't seek domination or defeat, but rather, understanding, growth and compassion. It's only a war if our goal is subjugation, which I'm not seeing in Jesus' witness.
